We had a really useful conversation about the transition of any pupils who move from Bronington to SJT in future years - from a Welsh to an English Curriculum. We are both committed to ensuring that this transition is effective and smooth for all future pupils.

Welsh National Tests

Over the next few weeks, all children from year 2 to year 6 will complete the Welsh National Tests. The tests are all done on computer and are adaptive which means that they can get individually harder or easier depending on the pupil's success rates. There are 3 tests, reading comprehension, maths procedural (calculations) and mathematical reasoning (problem solving). We will support all children through the tests and they will complete familiarisation exercises. But just for parental information, it is now no longer possible to leave a question out and come back to it!! As with all tests it is a snapshot, and the key information is what your child can do and what their next steps are rather than the result on the day.
