Dear Carers and Parents,

Thank you for your patience, interest and your engagement in the recent consultation on a proposal to federate Bronington School with the Madras School, Penley. We received a good number of positive responses which were reviewed by the governing body at our meeting last week but the decision was taken that the Federation proposal would not be taken forward. However, within the Bronington school community there was clearly an appetite for a collaborative approach and therefore from September 2023 we will be entering into a formal Collaboration Agreement with the Maelor Church Schools Federation (Borderbrook and St Paul's).

A Collaboration Agreement will provide Bronington school with many of the benefits of a federation in terms of being able to share a headteacher and work closely with a larger group of staff, but the schools will retain their separate identities, budgets and governing bodies. The agreement will be reviewed after an initial twelve month period. A partnership agreement does not require a governing body to consult with its stakeholders. Mrs Emma Jones will be the Headteacher of Ysgol Bronington, supported by Mrs Louise Davies who is newly appointed as Teacher in Charge.

Mrs Emma Jones, the headteacher of the Maelor Church Schools Federation, is keen to have the opportunity to meet parents before the end of term. Mrs Emma Jones will be on site today, Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> June, at the end of the day to informally meet parents and carers.
