Class 3 went to Maelor Nurseries to help build bug hotels in order to support the improvement of biodiversity at their site. The children learnt about Maelor Nurseries and what they do before splitting into two teams to work together to create 'bug hotels'. In teams they discussed what kinds of mini beasts and creepy crawlies may move in once construction was complete. Next, they examined the bug hotel plans on display before investigating the building materials on offer. The children used sticks, pinecones, bamboo, bricks, cardboard, bark, wood shavings and compost to construct their bug hotel in and around a stack of pallets. Designs were examined, evaluated, demolished, redesigned and reconstructed to ensure that all bugs had somewhere to call home. Once construction was complete, managers from the business came to judge the team's work. Everyone had a wonderful time and thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to learn about and work with a local business.
